

This is a nicely done book, with good photos and some clever ideas and techniques for using fabric bits and pieces. The directions are clear and easy to follow. I think many families, especially with young children, would enjoy a lot of the crafts. The kids would like wearing things like the lace cuffs and the leather bangles. There are several ways to use denim scraps, and most growing families in the U.S. have left over jeans. The book isn't as useful to me as I had hoped, mostly because I'm old, not the type to wear fabric necklaces, and with only one grandchild, already grown. I am making the scrap mice in the book, and using them as "free with a purchase" in a gift shop where I volunteer. They seem popular.

I also would like to see more diagrams, photos for the 'how-to' instructions.
