If Aristotle's Metaphysics is difficult (and it is - at least for this student) then Aquinas' Commentary at the very least must be said to make it possible to understand. This is a brilliant work which should be read by those who wish to understand the arguments that Aristotle and Aquinas offer in support

of the proposition that God exists. I do not think that the argument presented here is easily dismissed. As a warning to prospective readers: I strongly advise you to acquire a general familiarity with Aristotle's works and philosophy before attempting this, lest the background arguments previously established by the authors present obstacles to understanding what is discussed in this book. The Metaphysics was not written in a philosophical vacuum; rather it builds upon principles and conclusions established elsewhere (most especially but not exclusively in the Physics and On the Soul). God exists. Aristotle and Aquinas show this to be the case. What follows as a consequence of this awesome fact is a subject of other works.
