

I was very impressed with the detail, although some people may find it a little too much. It may be 2012, but film is not dead, and the need for a proper darkroom is still just as important. Sure some of the pricing might be off, but the plans and ideas are certainly still quite applicable. The tutorials, equipment lists and diagrams are invaluable and this book is one of the few places that goes into such detail anymore! Highly recommended!
