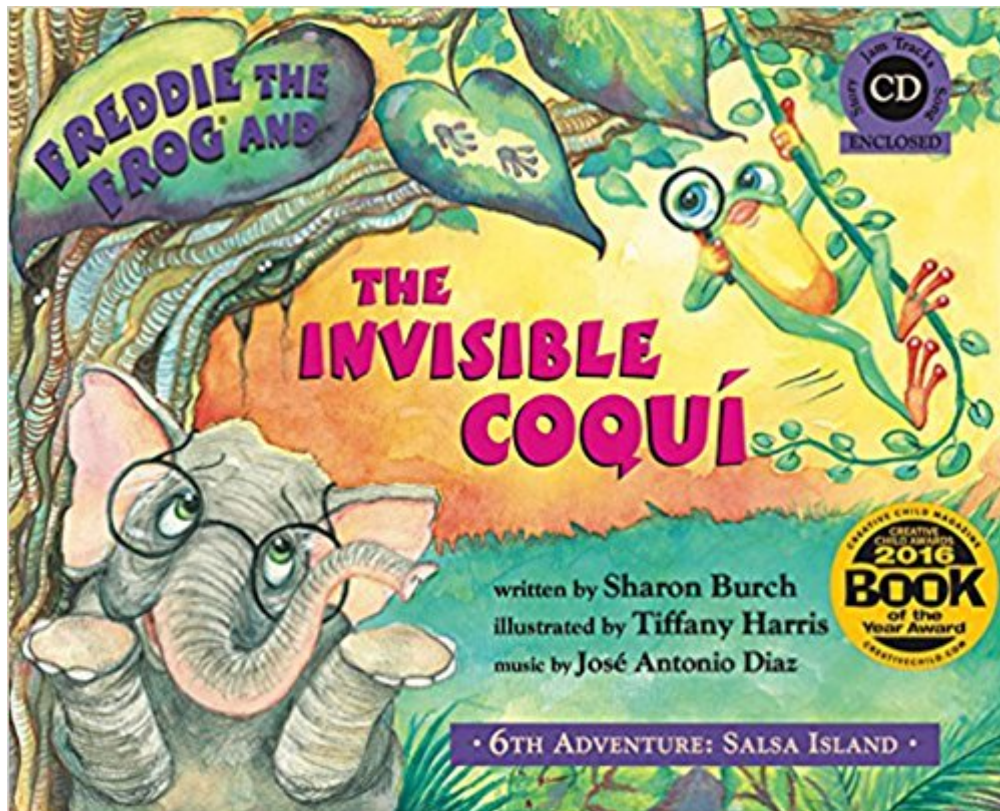




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Freddie The Frog And The Invisible Coqui

My students love the Spanish words they learn during the story, and since then, we have been singing Hello Freddie in Spanish as a special treat! The salsa steps and spoken rhythms are fun and easy for the children to learn in one class period, and they enjoy getting up and moving along with Freddie when it's time to dance. I love the mystery behind the coqui and how they are introduced throughout the story as well as the instrument names that are taught. I use the story to reintroduce, reinforce and to springboard off of into playing rhythm patterns and naming and grouping the instruments. All in all a great story with so many possibilities for lesson development! Thanks, Sharon!
