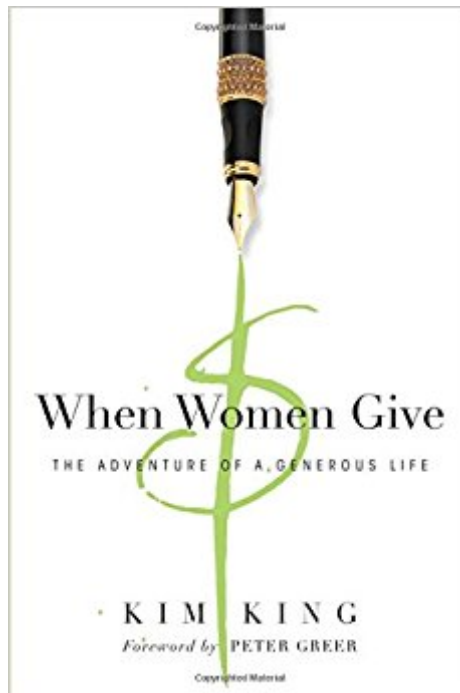

Kim King's book doesn't stop with the what of giving, but explores the whys and gives a blueprint for how. I love her writing style: clear simplicity interlaced with inspiring stories of giving, and how faith informs giving.

Short and to the point, author and philanthropist Kim King has written a primer on how to live a generous lifestyle. In nineteen chapters she covers a map on how to get started, how to evaluate ministries and organizations, and how to look at the things that block people from giving. She includes the importance of community, and the unexpected blessings of a generous lifestyle. Unabashedly Christian in her perspective, she laces her narrative with good humor, anecdotes and Scripture. King points out that women give more to philanthropic causes than men, and says, "...women today have more access to and influence over wealth than any of their sisters before them.... There is nothing less than a revolution taken place." The book is a quick read and chock full of helpful information - things like questions to ask, charts to determine one's values and expenditures, and lists of categories that may align with one's purpose. Every serious giver and those who wonder about giving more need to read "When Women Give." There has been a big, gaping hole in books regarding this issue, and this little book will likely become a classic.

Really enjoyed this book, it was so practical and had many recommendations of where to go if you had questions. Her illustrations were excellent, helped me understand the points she was making. I liked her example where she had to go through several financial advisors before she found one she liked. I plan to share this book with others who are generous or could be and want to learn how to leverage their personal assets to help ministries.

She peppers the book with real stories of women who are on this adventure and addresses some of the challenges to giving, such as how fear affects our generosity, something with which I can definitely relate!
