

Science Research Writing For Non-Native Speakers Of English



Synopsis

This book is designed to enable non-native English speakers to write science research for publication in English. It can also be used by English speakers and is a practical, user-friendly book intended as a fast, do-it-yourself guide for those whose English language proficiency is above intermediate. The approach is based on material developed from teaching graduate students at Imperial College London and has been extensively piloted. The book guides the reader through the process of writing science research and will also help with writing a Master's or Doctoral thesis in English. Science writing is much easier than it looks because the structure and language are conventional. The aim of this book is to help the reader discover a template or model for science research writing and then to provide the grammar and vocabulary tools needed to operate that model. There are five units: Introduction, Methodology, Results, Discussion/Conclusion and Abstract. The reader develops a model for each section of the research article through sample texts and exercises; this is followed by a Grammar and Writing Skills section designed to respond to frequently-asked questions as well as a Vocabulary list including examples of how the words and phrases are to be used.

I work with graduate students in the sciences and many of the students (both international and non) struggle with writing. This book gives a nice overview of writing in the sciences by going through each of the sections of a standard scientific paper (introduction, Methods, Results, Abstract, etc). Within each section there are grammar and vocabulary tips, which are great for non-native speakers and features from template phrases to help add structure and variety to writing. This is intended for students with a high level of English skills (definitely not for beginners - I would say high-intermediate and advanced level only).

This is an excellent book for scientific writing. This book is meant for writing a paper and it drives home the point from page one. The exercises in the book are immensely helpful and so are the models for different sections of a paper. Writing a paper used to be a nightmare for me. This book has certainly helped me alleviate the fear. I have used few other writing manuals, such as Strunk and White, before. While they are excellent at pointing out what to do, they fail to motivate the reasons behind the commandment. This is also where this book excels. In every chapter, the author analyzes test cases and explains the reasons behind using a particular tense or a particular voice. As an ESL student, these clarifications are extremely helpful and enlightening to me. In conclusion, I definitely recommend buying this book.
